Some players will be sighted in our Global Youth Sevens team next month and some filtered through to last month's Under 20s development camp.

Further to pathways, how good is it to see the likes of Josh Jacomb play for the All Blacks XV? Just three years ago, he was in our Barbarians

under the coaching of Warren Gatland that faced the Heartland XV in Taupo. Others to rise swiftly from being noticed in our colours are lock Tahlor Cahill, who was in our Under 20s in 2022 and is now a Crusader, while No 8 Nikora Broughton, in that same team under Steve Jackson, has been in top form in the NPC for Bay of Plenty and is in the Highlanders. I always tell people, too, it's not just our players, but our coaches and managers who get a chance to shine.

The two big Baabaas events coming up are our AGM on Wednesday November 27 at 6pm and the annual Christmas party, from 4pm on Friday December 6. Let's get along in numbers. We have a new band for the party and I'm told they'll play a nice musical mix from back in the day and some of today's hits.

Deaths Of Members

'Sir 'Tony' O'Reilly (1936-2024)

Sir Anthony 'Tony' O'Reilly was one of the great Ireland and Lions wings, and made a huge impression on the 1959 Lions tour of New Zealand, where he scored 17 tries, a record at the time, on the end of an often brilliant backline.

This was his second Lions tour. He was just a teenager when he went to South Africa in 1955. His 37 Lions tries are unmatched and superseded his output in 29 Tests for Ireland from 1955-70 out of the Old Belvedere club and the Leinster province. Furthermore, he made at least 30 first-class appearances for the UK Barbarians club.

Tony cut a dashing and charismatic figure both on and off the field. He won wider fame as a businessman, his company Independent News and Media owning the New Zealand Herald from 1996-2008, and he was the chairman of Heinz, among many other positions.

In recent years, Tony, who was knighted in 2001 for services to Northern Ireland, lived in France and the USA.

Fife McGuigan (1926-2024)

Fife McGuigan was one of our oldest members, at 97, and had been a Barbarian since 1968.

He was a rarity in first-class rugby in that he appeared for five different provinces and seven clubs during his career as a lock/loose forward. His work in the NZ Forest Service took him to Bay of Plenty, which he represented in 1946 (out of the Rangiuru club), 1948 (out of Rotorua HSOB) and 1953 (out of Pukehina), Canterbury in 1947 (out of the Christchurch club), King Country in 1949 (out of Waitete), Auckland from 1950-52 and 1954 (out of Ponsonby), and Wanganui (out of Kaierau) in 1955-56.

In 1954, he lived in Rotorua but would drive a truckload of timber up to Auckland on Friday nights, then play for his Ponies club the next day before heading back home.

He also appeared for the NZ Barbarians in 1954, the North Island in 1950-51 and was an All Blacks trialist in 1948, '51 and '56.

In all, Fife scored 12 tries in 66 first-class games.

BAABAAS TEAMS REVIEW



As Mr President mentioned, our teams in the traditional red of the Barbarians have been in the thick of it over the past couple of months.

The NZ Barbarians won a first-class fixture over the NZ Heartland XV in Whanganui by 40-21, despite the wet weather. Under the coaching of Milton Haig, members Dion Waller and Guy Lennox and Kingi Matenga, who was previously with the NZ Barbarians Area Schools, the side included some prime 2024 NPC performers, such as lock Jesse Parete of Taranaki, Counties Manukau midfielder Gibson Popoali'i, No 10 Callum Harkin of Wellington, who kicked the winning goal in the NPC final, and centre James Tofa of Manawatu. Popoali'i was called into training by Moana Pasifika, which shows you how crucial these pathways are.

This was the third time we have seen this fixture since inception in 2021 (for three Baabaas wins, we might add), and we have seen the likes of Josh Jacomb move up the national ratings from 2021. Lock James Thompson was Steelers captain in 2024 and an integral part of the Blues. Last year's Baabaas wing Josh Gray was one of the Rugby Almanack's promising players of the year.

The Barbarians Under 18 boys gave two good displays in

Hamilton, falling 57-47 to Australia U18 and beating Samoa Schools 102-10. The side was coached by Darren Larsen, Tasesa Lavea and Greg Feek and managed by James Kumate. This team is hugely important and well entrenched in the New Zealand system, having been established in 2012.

The Barbarians Under 18 girls, in just their second season, enjoyed a fine week in camp last month, winning both their games, 71-0 versus a PIR U18 girls' selection and 29-15 against the NZ Maori U18 girls in Pukekohe. This team, which features in the latest *Rugby News* mag, had a high-powered coaching and management staff of Anna Richards, Emma Jensen, Ella Blackwell and Aleisha-Pearl Nelson, with your club secretary Monalisa Codling doubling as manager and oxygen-deprived AR on the first match day. Many of the team has already played Farah Palmer Cup and were identified in the national Under 20 camp. Some will surely be Black Ferns of the future.

The NZ Barbarians Area Schools, established in 2013, had a productive week in camp in Hanmer Springs, pulled together by member Steve Beck. Whilst defeated by Canterbury Maori U18 45-17, they made big strides from their first match, where they were outclassed by Rangiora HS First XV, a slick outfit that had won the Championship section of the Miles Toyota competition.

On the horizon is the Global Youth Sevens in Auckland next month. The club has entered a girls team, to be coached by member Sherwin Stowers, himself a former All Blacks Sevens rep.
